On November 21, 2022, the Department will be requesting a permanency plan change for Zaydan Fulp, Brooklyn Njoya, and Skylar Njoya. The Department is requesting that the permanency plan change from reunification to reunification with a concurrent plan of adoption. The change is being requested due to continued concerns for domestic violence as you were recently arrested on October 17, 2022, for violating a current protection from abuse order. Additionally, there continues to be concerns about the lack of change that has been displayed based on your recent behaviors exhibited, despite the extensive services that have been court ordered.

If you do not agree with this action or decision, please call the worker whose name is below. He or she can explain the basis for the action or decisions above and your right to request a fair hearing. Appeal procedures are on the back of this letter. **(PLEASE NOTE: Notice of a court hearing is not subject to appeal).*

WHAT TO DO IF YOU DON'T AGREE WITH THIS DECISION

You can call the telephone number on the other side of this letter and ask for a conference. Your worker will be able to answer any questions you may have.

You can also file an appeal. Your local department has the necessary forms and will help you file an appeal. Call the number on the other side of this letter for appeal forms and more information about how to file an appeal.

NOTE: AN APPEAL MAY NOT BE FILED FOR ANY DECISION WHICH HAS BEEN, OR MAY ONLY BE, DETERMINED BY A COURT.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU APPEAL

Appeal hearings are conducted by the Office of Administrative Hearings. Appeal hearings will be scheduled at a time and place convenient for you and the administrative law judge who will hear your case. You should come to this hearing. If you wish, you can be represented by a lawyer or a friend or relative. You may be able to get legal help through the Legal Aid Bureau in some areas of the State. In Baltimore City, Legal Aid's office is at 714 E. Pratt Street, 7th floor. (Telephone number: 410-539-5340). In the counties, your worker will advise you regarding whether free legal services might be available.

At least six days before the hearing, the local department will send you a summary of the information used to reach its decisions and copies of all documents it will present at the hearing. If you want any employees of the local department to be present at your hearing, you must notify the Office of Administrative Hearings and state why you want these employees to be present. You or your representative can look at your case record to help you prepare for the hearing, with the exception of information that the department must keep confidential.

At a hearing, you will have the right to bring witnesses and documents in your support. You will also be able to question witness presented by the local department.

An administrative law judge will send you a written decision, which says whether the local department's decision was correct within 90 days after receiving your appeal request.

You must file your appeal within 90 days of the date of this letter. If the Department intends to reduce or terminate services, or had done so, and you file an appeal within 10 days of the date of the letter, services will be continued or reinstated until a decision is reached on your letter, unless continuing service would threaten the health or safety of any other persons.
